I've had the wonderful privilege of seeing them at work, accepting with grace the duties to which they've been called to, and moving forward prayerfully and responsibly. You can all be rest assured that these men and women are called by God Himself for such a time as this!

After announcing my retirement, someone said to me "what have we done to you?" Oh my goodness! The congregation of First Lutheran has done nothing but bless both Steve and I. My retirement has absolutely *nothing* to do with what the congregation has done or not done. Rather it has everything to do with where I'm at in my life and how I sense God calling me. At this time, I have no idea what the future holds. First and foremost, I want to rest and be quiet before the LORD. I need to be refreshed, renewed, and in some ways restored in Christ. I also want to have more time to spend with my family and grandchildren before they're all graduated from high school. And then, in God's timing, I know He'll call me to my next kingdom assignment as our work here on earth is never done until we meet Jesus face to face.

You need to know that my ten years of serving the congregation of First Lutheran have been some of the most joyful, rewarding days of my life and I thank you from the bottom of my heart. You've been gracious, patient, responsive and compassionate with me in every way. Most importantly, I've had the great joy of being able to see so many of you grow in your relationship with Jesus Christ and in your service to Him in this world. *That truly* has been a most humbling privilege.

So please, encourage me by staying hopeful and faithful, trusting that the LORD truly does work all things together for good for those who love him and are called according to His purposes. (Rom 8:28)


### MEN'S BIBLE STUDY
